Briefly on the Unitarian Faith

The Unitarian Faith in the Khasi and Jaintia Hills was founded by Late Rev. Hajom Kissor Singh Nongbri on 18th September, 1887 when he was about 23 years old. The first person to join him was Late Mr. Thom Singh who was then about 20 years old. With that small beginning the number grew and today the Members of the Unitarian Faith are found in the Khasi Hills, Jaintia Hills, Karbi Anglong and other places.

Hajom Kissor Singh was a religious leader, a social worker, a reformer, a healer, a friend of the rejected, a great contributor towards education especially the recognition of the Khasi language in school at that time. He was instrumental along with Soso Tham and Samuel Shalam to get Khasi as a medium of instruction and examination up to class VI from 1902. Along with others he was entrusted with the task to complete the "English – Khasi Dictionary" (1920) which was started by his brother Mr. Nissor Singh who passed away in Tura, Garo Hills in the middle of the work. The hymn book and religious books of the Unitarian Church which contains original hymns and translated version by Hajom Kissor Singh showed the knowledge and depth he had on the Khasi language.
