The execution of the above mentioned activities highlighted various outcomes that fulfil the students' aim of the visit, that is, to gather insight on the community led approach. The learnings gathered throughout are mentioned below:

- 1) The seed (sense of ownership, resistance towards the construction of the dam, sense of ownership towards the inherited resources) that spread the roots of awareness towards the neighboring villages.
- 2) The obstacle that were met.
- 3) The success of the self-led organization through the participation of the residents
- 4) Their recognition of the need for sustenance through their livelihood which cut



utilize the natural resources sustainably.

- 5) The unnumerable resources which they are able to acquire from nature itself.
- 6) Folktales and stories from the different villages.
- 7) The significance of intervention by the Dorbar or local administrative council.

The event enhanced the consciousness of the existing indigenous knowledge system and practices held wisely by the participants of the day. The elders present in the valedictory shared anecdotal and episodic narratives on what led 'KaKynhunki Nongrep harud Wah Umngot' to initiate a movement driven by their determination to safeguard and preserve the bedrock of their livelihood with a clear vision for what is best for well-being of their existence and how to sustain it for the generations to follow
