The Culinary Club in collaboration with the Art Club put up a stall on 20th of February, 2023 on the occasion of Edblazon 2023 at College Cafeteria, St. Edmund's College. The stalls were put up from around 10:00 am morning that went up to 2:00 pm. There were two stalls and the food items sold comprised of Laphing, Spring Roll, Sweet Corn, fries, Hot Chocolate Drink, Pakora, Pastries, Aloo Muri Chat, Jeera Juice and Mimi Singju.

The food items that were loved by all especially the two traditional items i.e. laphing (which is a traditional Tibetan dish that looks like a roll-made from all purpose flour and filled with a delicate mixture which has a very distinct flavour of chilly oil and garlic) and Mimi Singju (which is a famous snack of Manipur made up of a mixture of green leafy vegetables, dried fish powder, Perilla powder, black salt, onion, dried chillies, chickpeas, lime juice and Mimi) This was its first official collaboration with another club since establishment and acted as a source of motivation for participation as more of students are willing to put up food stalls during similar college events.



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
