






















# REPORT OF ALL THE ACTIVITES IN NCC 2022-23

## Introduction

The Unit was raised on 15th Sep 1954 as 8 Assam Sig NCC at Darang. It moved to Shillong on 17 July 1957 and was re-designated as 1 Assam Sig Coy NCC. It was re-designated as 42 Assam Sig Coy NCC on 1st April 1969. On creation of the State of Meghalaya, it was predesignated as 42 Meghalaya Signal Company NCC on 22 Jan 1972.

It was re-designated as 2 Meghalaya (I) Coy NCC on 1st April 2004. It was re-designated again as 42 Meghalaya Signal Company NCC on 30th Sep 2004.

The boys wing of NCC unit of St. Edmund's College was under 42 before the Company became a full swing Unit by also including the SW Wing, i.e. the girl cadets since the year 2020.

The cadets are encouraged to attend camps such as Annual Training, Army Attachment, National Integration, Thal Sainik, Shooting Competition, Mountaineering, Basic and Advanced leadership Camps. Republic Day, etc., since attending camps is mandatory for appearing in the "B" or "C" certificate examinations. Regular NCC classes are held on normal class days. The ANO and the senior cadets along with the PI staff from the unit assist in conducting these classes.

# **Briefing of Camps in NCC**

- Annual Training Camps/ Combined Annual Training Camps (ATC/CATC): These are held within the State under the aegis of respective NCC Directorates.
- Centrally Organized Camps (COC): These camps are of all India nature and are planned by Headquarter DGNCC in consultation with State NCC Directorates which conduct them. Selected cadets, as per the vacancies allotted to each Directorate, participate in these camps. The following types of centrally organized camps are conducted: –
- National Integration Camps (NIC)/ Special National Integration Camps (SNIC): National Integration Camps and Special National Integration Camps are conducted to make cadets understand and value the rich heritage of cultures that forge unity despite the diverse languages, traditions and religions of our country. These camps are conducted on an all India basis and help bridge the cultural gap among various states of India. 37 National Integration Camps are conducted every year. In addition, six Special NICs are conducted in the extremities of our country at Leh / Srinagar (J&K), Dimapur (North Eastern Region), Peddapuram (Kakinada), Badabagh (Jaisalmer), Lakshadweep and Port Blair.
- Leadership Camps: Six Advance Leadership Camps (ALC), are conducted every year, which a total of 1350 cadets attend to focus on personality development, leadership skills and orientation for induction into the Armed Forces.
- Thal Sainik Camp (TSC): Two TSCs are conducted at HQ DGCC Camp, Parade Ground, Delhi Cantt every year in Sep/Oct, one for SD/JD boys and other for SW/JW girls. 680 Boy and 680 Girl cadets take part in each camp.
- Rock Climbing Training Camps (RCTC): Eight rock climbing camps are held each year to expose NCC cadets to the basics of rock

climbing and to inculcate spirit of adventure. A total of 1080 cadets attend the camps.

- Annual Republic Day Camp: The Annual Republic Day Camp (RDC) is held at Garrison Parade Ground, Delhi Cantt every year from 01 Jan to 29 Jan. 2070 selected NCC cadets from all States and Union Territories attend the camp. This camp represents all parts of India and is a 'Mini India' in itself. The camp is normally inaugurated by the Vice President of India in the first week of Jan and culminates with the Prime Minister's Rally on 28 January. It is a matter of great pride for a cadet to be selected to represent his/ her state in the Republic Day Camp.
- Prime Minister's Rally: The Prime Minister's Rally, the most prestigious event of the NCC Republic Day Camp is held on 28 January every year. The PM's Rally commences with the Guard of Honour presented to Hon'ble Prime Minister by NCC Cadets. Contingents from all State NCC Directorate participate in the March Past. Social activities being undertaken by NCC are displayed in the form of tableaux. Approximately 3,000 cadets participate in this rally wherein they display their skills in equestrian, parasailing, band display, slithering and simulated Army action. Microlight Display by the NCC cadets is also conducted during the PM's Rally. The PM's Rally culminates with award of Prime Minister's Banner to the winning Directorate by the Hon'ble Prime Minister. The events are witnessed by a number of dignitaries that include Hon'ble Raksha Mantri, Raksha Rajya Mantri, three Service Chiefs and the Defence Secretary.
- Youth Exchange Programme (YEP): Selected NCC cadets
  participate in Youth Exchange Programme which is a country to
  country exchange of cadets belonging to NCC/ equivalent Govt/
  youth organizations of friendly countries. They participate in NCC

activities of the host country to create an increased awareness and appreciation of each other's socio-economic and cultural realities. NCC has a vibrant YEP with ten countries. The benefits of this programme have been widely acknowledged. Our cadets share strong bond with our YEP partners. As of now more than 100 cadets proceed abroad on YEP annually.

- Adventure Based Learning: Adventure is the life blood of youth. Adventure training in the NCC provides knowledge to cadets of the topography as well as experience of different weather conditions and adventurous living under camp conditions. The whole aim is to inculcate a spirit of adventure, explorative inquisitiveness, develop stamina, endurance, discipline, courage, determination, comradeship, leadership leading to development of self-confidence, team spirit and spirit-de- corps amongst NCC cadets. NCC cadets are given the opportunity to participate in a host of adventure activities including Mountain Treks and Expeditions, Trekking, Parasailing, Sailing, Scuba Diving, Kayaking, Camel safari etc. Adventure based activities enable cadets to hone leadership skills and enhance their character qualities. Cadets with potential are given opportunities to participate in expeditions requiring higher degree of expertise and proficiency.
- Mountaineering Expeditions: NCC has been conducting two mountaineering expeditions every year, one each for the girl and boy cadets. Since 1970, the NCC has conducted 75 Mountaineering expeditions, of which 40 were for boys and 35 for girls.Mt Rudugaira (5819m), Mt Deo Tibba (6001m), Mt Gangotri I (6672m) and Mt Kamet (7746m) are some of the mountains that have been scaled by NCC cadets. History was created when the first ever Mt Everest Expedition of NCC Cadets (Boys) scaled the world's highest peak in two batches on 19 and 20 May 2013.

- All India Trekking Expedition: 29 Trekking Expedition are conducted annually with participation of 14500 Cadets from all State NCC Directorates.
- Camps like **Ek Bharat Shrest Bharat (EBSB)** has also played an important role in terms of a national camp in bringing cadets from all over India together.

# **National Camps**

National camps in the National Cadet Corps (NCC) are significant events that provide cadets with an opportunity to enhance their skills, undergo specialized training, and participate in various activities. These camps aim to develop the leadership qualities, discipline, and overall personality of the cadets. Here are a few key points about national camps in the NCC.

- <u>Objective</u>: National camps in the NCC serve multiple objectives. They aim to promote unity, camaraderie, and understanding among cadets from different regions and backgrounds. These camps also provide a platform for cadets to showcase their talents, engage in competitive activities, and learn from experienced trainers and resource personal
- 2. <u>Duration and Location</u>: National camps are usually held for a specific duration, ranging from a few days to a couple of weeks. These may include drills, physical fitness exercises, adventure sports, shooting, map reading, cultural performances, leadership workshops, and seminars on various subjects. The curriculum is designed to challenge and develop the cadets' mental, physical, and emotional capabilities.
- 4. Exposure and Interaction: National camps provide an excellent platform for cadets to interact with fellow cadets and trainers from different parts of the country. This exposure allows them to exchange ideas, learn from each other's experiences, and broaden their horizons. They also get the opportunity to interact with distinguished personalities, military officials, and experts in their respective fields.
- 5. <u>Recognition and Awards</u>: Outstanding cadets who excel in various aspects of the camp activities may receive recognition and awards. These awards serve as an acknowledgment of their achievements and motivate them to continue their dedication and hard work. They may include certificates of merit, trophies, medals, or even scholarships for further education.

## ➢ RD CAMP

**Republic Day Camp (RDC):** The Republic Day Camp is a prestigious national camp held in New Delhi, coinciding with India's Republic Day celebrations. Cadets from different states and directorates come

together to participate in various activities, including a grand parade at Rajpath, cultural performances, flag hoisting ceremonies, and interactions with dignitaries. The RDC showcases the best talent and discipline of the NCC cadets.



## EBSB CAMP

The EBSB Camp in the National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a unique and impactful program that combines adventure, discipline, and patriotism. EBSB stands for Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, which translates to "One India, Great India." 
