REPORT ON: CLUB INDUCTION PROGRAM



 - Feel welcomed and encouraged to participate actively.



Artwork was submitted at St Anthony's college at around 1:30 pm.

The poster competition was held during the International Conference on Literature, Community and Culture organized be the department of English in collaboration with the Departments of Khasi and History, St Anthony's college, sponsored by NEC Shillong, Meghalayan Age Limited, ICSSR-NERC and Department of Arts and culture, Government of Meghalaya.

Theme of the competition was the origin of the names of places in shillong that we're very much familiar with today and how through time, these places acquired their name. We were asked to
