## MARA TRIBE OF MIZORAM

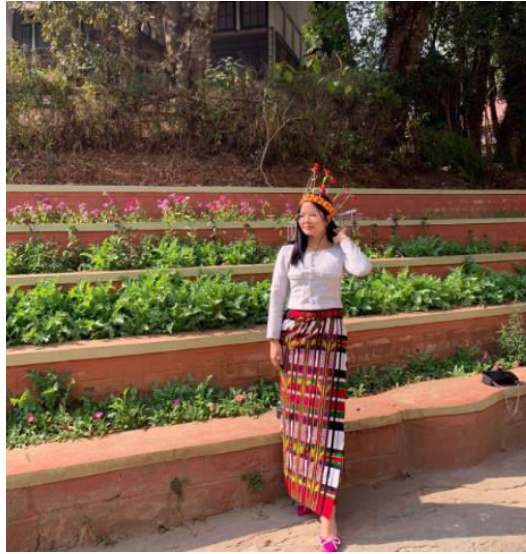

In the Thankgul tribe of Manipur, the women drape a sarong which is known as the “Phangyal Kashan”. The necklace that completes the attire is called the “Kongsang”

## JAINTIA TRIBE OF MEGHALAYA



The dhara which is a piece of clothing pinned from the shoulder which hangs around the upper part is called the “Muka stem”. The jainpein which is sarong wrapped around the waist is known as the “Ibobrew stem or Ryndia stem” and the red and gold beaded necklace is known as the “Paila”.

## GARO TRIBE OF MEGHALAYA



The beautiful headgear is made of hen's feather and it is called the "Dome". The midi type sarong is called the "Dakmanda".

The long silver neck piece is known as “U Kynjri Thabah” and the bracelets are called “Ki Mahu”. The yellow piece of clothing pinned on the shoulder, wrapped around the body is called the “Dhara Shad”

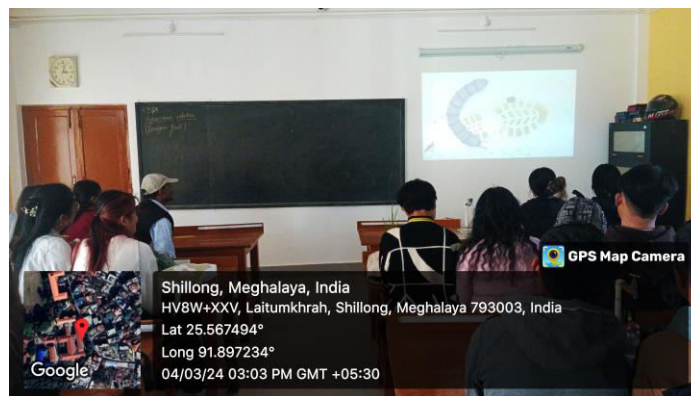
