



JAINTIA TRIBE OF MEGHALAYA



The dhara which is a piece of clothing pinned from the shoulder which hangs around the upper part is called the "Muka stem". The jainpein which is sarong wrapped around the waist is known as the "Ibobrew stem or Ryndia stem" and the red and gold beaded necklace is known as the "Paila".

The midi type sarong is called the "Dakmanda".


KHASI TRIBE OF MEGHALAYA
