The NSS Unit of St. Edmund's College, Shillong, took the opportunity to conduct a Special Camp at Mylliem Kyndong Nongkyntier from the 10th of April to the 17th of April 2023. The camp was a great opportunity for the volunteers to participate. A total of 53 volunteers took part in the camp, along with the Programme Officers who accompanied them.

During the camp, a number of home visits and mobilization activities were carried out, as there had been a gap of about 4-5 months since the previous camp in the same village. Moreover, surveys were conducted in the adopted village, during which volunteers completed 50 surveys on the first day, 60 surveys on the second day, and 26 surveys on the third day. For the surveys conducted during the Special Camp, the volunteers divided themselves into groups of 5-6. Each group was given 10 survey forms and was assigned to different directions of the adopted village to conduct the surveys.

Another activity conducted at the camp was a friendly football match between the Seng Samla Shnong and St. Edmund's College football team. This event was highly anticipated by the youth of the village and the volunteers, as it was one of the activities that captured the interest and excitement of the youth. It also allowed them to interact with each other with an attitude of sportsmanship. The match ended with St. Edmund's College emerging as the winner. Lunch was served to all the players of both teams and the NSS volunteers of the camp.





Learning outcome: The NSS volunteers gained valuable insights into the status of education and employment among the local youth through the surveys they conducted in the adopted village. The volunteers experienced ups and downs during the surveys, but these challenges helped them improve their communication skills. They displayed patience towards the community members and learned from the responses and opinions shared by the people during the surveys.

The football match between the St. Edmund's College team and the youth football team also instilled in them a spirit of active participation and sportsmanship throughout the engagement.

6. TREE PLANTATION AT RI-BHOI DISTRICT

A tree plantation drive was conducted by the NSS Unit of St. Edmund's College on the 29th of July 2023 at Khapmara, a village in the Ri-Bhoi District. A total of 65 saplings, obtained from the Forest Department of Meghalaya, were planted in Khapmara Village, which served as the location for the plantation drive.

A total of 25 NSS volunteers participated in the plantation drive. Each volunteer was tasked with clearing the area where the sapling was to be planted, digging the soil, planting, and watering the saplings. A distance of 5 feet was maintained between each sapling.

After the plantation drive, the entire area was cleaned thoroughly, and polythene and other plastic bags from the saplings were collected, gathered, and properly disposed of.

Learning Outcome: Tree plantation was a new experience for some of the new volunteers who got their first chance to learn how to plant saplings with the help and guidance of the senior volunteers. The volunteers were also briefed on the importance of trees and plants, as well as the roles each person plays in contributing to this noble cause of protecting our environment and mitigating climate change. The programme was successful as a total of 65 saplings were planted.

On the 15th of August 2023, the NSS Unit conducted a sensitization programme on women's health and hygiene, with special emphasis on the use of sanitary pads, in Mylliem Kyndong Nongkyntir.

A total of 58 villagers from Kyndong Nongkyntir participated in this programme. Reusable sanitary pads were distributed among all the participants, along with instructions on how to use them. Additionally, 100 national flags were distributed as part of the *Har Ghar Tiranga* initiative.

A total of 30 volunteers participated in organizing this programme.

Reusable pads make sense from a sustainability and environmental perspective, but they are beneficial in many other ways too. Reusable sanitary pads are safe because they are usually made from natural materials. They are eco-friendly, healthier, cheaper (reusable), and comfortable. Cleanliness and hygiene are among the most important properties of sanitary products.

The sensitization programme in Mylliem was a successful initiative. It will contribute significantly to maintaining health and hygiene in society.

Towards the end, the Resource person took time to explain to the women about the Mutual funds from which they can invest as the interest is high compare to that of the bank. Three important points of Financial Management given by the Resource person which are important for the women to achieved their goals. They need to understand that:

- 1. The starting point is always the Budget
- 2. The End point is the Goal
- 3. And to achieve the goal is through Investment.

The program ended by 1:30 PM.

A programme on Solid Waste Management: Vermicomposting was conducted on 21-10-2023 by the National Service Scheme in collaboration with the Environment Department. The resource person for the programme was Ma'am Lari Jeengap. A total of 56 participants, along with 8 volunteers, attended the programme. The programme started at 1 pm and ended at 2:30 pm.

During the programme, Ma'am Lari explained the process of earthworm digestion and aerobic decomposition using the activities of micro- and macro-organisms at room temperature. Vermicomposting, or worm composting, produces a rich organic soil amendment containing a diversity of plant nutrients and beneficial micro-organisms. She also taught us the importance of properly managing the worms. It was explained that vermicomposting involves two methods:

>Bed methods: this is an easy method in which beds of organic methods are prepared.

> Pit methods: in this method, the organic matter is collected in cemented pits. However, this method is not prominent as it involves problems with poor aeration and waterlogging.

Mawsawa village is located in the Mylliem Sub-Division of East Khasi Hills District in Meghalaya. It is situated 18 kilometers away from the district headquarters, Shillong. There are about 67 households in Mawsawa village. Its total population is 273, out of which the male population is 121, while the female population is 152.

The literacy rate of Mawsawa village is 69.90%, with 71.07% of males and 67.42% of females being literate.

DAY 1 (24/01/2024)

THE OPENING AND SETTING UP THE CAMP IN THE VILLAGE

NSS special camp 2024 was held at Mawsawa and Rngi, Mylliem. The volunteers along with The POs started off their journey from the college at 10:30 AM. The journey towards the village was fun enjoyable and a wonderful experience. Everyone was excited, cheerful and looking forward towards the camp with lots of enthusiasm.

The team reach the village around 1 PM and upon reaching they divided themselves into groups led by Miss Iarisa Dorphang for the different activities that to be conducted in the two different villages. Around 2PM, a part of the volunteers started out setting the camp by cleaning the community hall for shelter, unloading the packages and other items from the buses, putting up the kitchen and cooking for dinner. While the other team members went for a transect walk. At 7 PM the volunteers had dinner followed by an evaluation with the POs at 9:00PM.



DAY 2(DATE 25/01/2024)

CONDUCT SURVEY

The NSS volunteers began their day at 6:30 AM. Following breakfast, they had a brief meeting with their Programme Officers to discuss the tasks that needed to be completed for the day, which included the "Youth Not in Formal Education or Regular Employment" survey.

The volunteers were assigned to visit people's homes to gather information for the survey, which aimed to understand youth issues and challenges, as well as their efforts to overcome them. Additionally, the survey aimed to collect data on the reasons for youth dropouts and those who had never attended school. The volunteers also sought to learn about the village youths' future plans, such as whether they intended to pursue further education or training in their field, or whether they planned to apply for government loans to start their own businesses.

The day ended with an evaluation session with the Programme Officers, during which the volunteers reported on the overall information gathered from the survey and planned the activities to be conducted the following day.

DAY 3(DATE 26/01/2024)

REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION, SURVEY & ACTIVITIES WITH THE CHILDREN

The volunteers started the day by waking up at 5:30 AM and freshening up. Breakfast was served at 7:30 AM. At 9:30 AM, they celebrated Republic Day by taking a pledge. Following that, the volunteers headed out for mobilization. They went door-to-door and talked to the villagers about the camp, as well as made them aware of the purpose of their visit to the village.

A survey was also conducted among the unemployed youth of the community, and a group of volunteers got the chance to meet the Headman, ASHA workers, Anganwadi workers, and the Women's Wing of the village. Around 1:00 PM, they had lunch after submitting the survey reports. Soon after lunch, some volunteers continued with the survey while others stayed at the campsite to organize games for the children.

They conducted a variety of games and fun learning sessions for Republic Day, such as musical chairs, popping balloons, action songs, and more. They also organized a drawing competition for the children, where the winners' received sweets as rewards. The volunteers had a lot of fun playing with the children. Refreshments were provided, followed by a jam session, which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

Around 5:00 PM, the volunteers returned to the campsite after completing their assigned activities. After dinner, they had a brief meeting with the POs to discuss plans for the next day.








DAY 4 (27 / 01/ 2024)





20. 3 DAY WORKSHOP SKILL FOR NSS VOLUNTEERS

The NSS conducted a 3-day workshop, "Skills for NSS Volunteers," on the 26th, 27th, and 28th of March 2024. The first-day session was on "Documentation & Reporting," conducted by Dr. Hazel B. Wahlang. The second-day session was on "Facilitation Skills," conducted by Randolph Langstieh. The third-day session was on "Survey Design," conducted by Dr. Oliver Gonsalves.

Thirty-four volunteers registered through a Google Form for the 3-day workshop. The first and second-day sessions were held in AV Room 4, St. Edmund's College, from 2:00 PM to 3:30 PM, while the third-day session was conducted online from 6:30 PM to 7:45 PM.

DAY 1 (26-03-2024)

The first session was on "Documentation and Reporting" by Dr. Hazel B. Wahlang. There were 21 volunteers who attended the session.

The first activity was related to reflection time, where Ma'am provided us with a sheet of paper to answer three questions: Why do you think documentation is important? What is the purpose of writing reports? In what ways will it benefit you as a student or as an NSS volunteer?

The second activity focused on the structure of technical writing. We had to gather ourselves into different groups to answer the questions: Who, what, where, when, why, and how. Each group then presented their discussions.

Dr. Wahlang also taught us how to write reports and create proper documentation. She was very precise about the format, font size, alignment, and other technical aspects of report writing. She emphasized how report writing can benefit students and volunteers in their academic and professional pursuits.


DAY 3 (28-03-2024)




