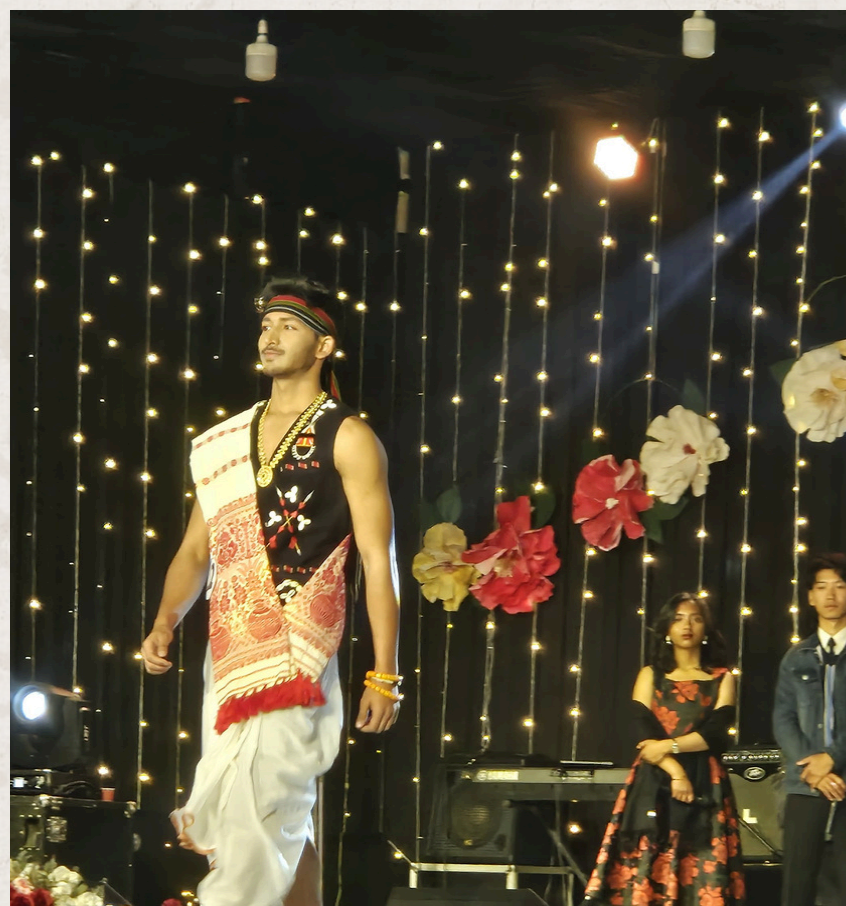
To the question “Your favorite 90’s Icon?,” Ma’am Ritisha said it has to be Madhuri Dixit; an absolute legend.

These words resonated deeply with those in the audience and reminded everyone that progress demands resilience, and true strength lies in embracing challenges with unwavering faith.

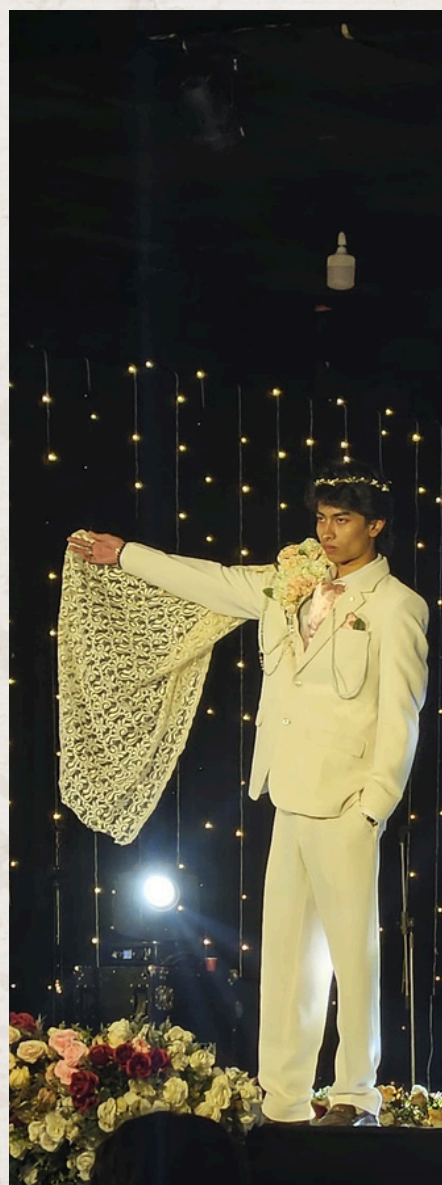
Round 2: The Couple's walk, where duos brought creativity, charm, and flair to the runway. Some were graceful, some playful, but all were captivating.
