Introduction

Session 1: Jal Jeevan Mission



Ms. Catherine Derica Kyndiah, District Project Manager of the District Project Management Unit (DPMU), Jal Jeevan Mission, Ri-Bhoi District was the resource person for the first session of the Virtual Organization Orientation Programme. She is one of the Alumni of Social Work Department.

Ms. Catherine gave a brief description of the work of Jal Jeevan Mission, she said that it was launched on 15th August 2019 by Our Honourable Prime Minister of India with an aim to provide Functional Household Tap Connection (FHTCs) to all rural household by 2024.

This Implementation Strategy was adopted to ensure that every rural household has FHTC in Meghalaya by 2023 and to meet the other objectives under this mission:



Other Objectives:

- Prioritize provision of FHTC in quality affected areas
- FHTC to institutions (Schools, Anganwadi Centres, etc.)
- Monitor functionality of tap connections
- To promote and ensure voluntary ownership among local community by way of contribution cash, kind and/or labour and voluntary labour
- To assist in ensuring sustainability of water supply system
- To empower and develop human resource in the sector
- Awareness on safe drinking water and involvement of stakeholders
- Making Water Supply System everybody's Business





She encourages the students social worker to volunteer, and lend their services to make Jal Jeevan Mission a reality as it promote the heath of the people where they will get access to hygienic water supply at their doorstep at an affordable rate. She calls them to work collaboratively with the community leaders, community members; to bring

awareness about the availability of the mission; and create ownership among the people to make it more sustainable.

Session 2: District Child Protection Unit



Mr. Teibormi Kyndiah, the District Child Protection Officer highlighted on the work carried out by the District Child Protection Unit, East Jaintia Hills, Meghalaya. He also briefed the students on the the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) which is a centrally sponsored scheme that aimed at building a protective environment for children in difficult circumstances, as well as other vulnerable children, through Government-Civil Society Partnership and on POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) Act.

The students were given a broad idea about the child protection policies that were implemented in the DCPU.



The resource person for the 3rd Session of the Virtual Organization Orientation Programme was Ms. Daphilarisa Khongwir who was an alumni of St. Edmund's College. She is currently working as Psychiatric Social Worker under the District Mental Health Programme, Nongpoh CHC, Ri-Bhoi Meghalaya.

She highlighted on the work of the District Mental Health Programme and the mental health issues that are prevalent especially during the Pandemic which made them emphasis more on Psycho-social wellness. She orient the students about the role of a psychiatric social worker and that main challenged that they faced right now is lack of manpower. She also encouraged the students to call this 14410- State Helpline Number for any concerns that they observed in the communities and/or they themselves needs someone to talk to.

She said that it was established in 2012 under the Indigenous partnership for Agrobiodiversity and Food Sovereignty (TIP), Rome and it aims to bring together traditional knowledge system and modern science. She also mentioned that NESFAS also aims at connecting people to the pleasure and importance of local food. Through the orientation programme, Ms. Ruth briefed the students about the different initiatives implemented by NESFAS.





Session 5: Grassroot





The resource person for the 5th Session of the Virtual Organization Orientation Programme was Mr. Amethyst Kynsai Kharwanniang, alumni of St. Edmund's College. He is currently working as a District Programme Coordinator, under the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana under the District Medical & Health Officer, Nongstoin, Megahlaya.





He said that PMMVY was renamed on 1st Jan 2017 but was first launched in 2010 as IGMSY (Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahyog Yojana). It is a Centrally Sponsored scheme which provides a cash incentive of ₹ 5000/- directly in the bank/post office account of Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers. He also encourages the students to volunteer in such scheme to encourage prenatal check-up, institutional deliveries, etc.

Session 7: Adolescent Friendly Clinic

She highlighted on the work of the clinic and also its outreach programme. She briefs the students on the GATHER approach while counselling the students which stand for: G- Greet; A- Ask; T-Talk; H- Help; E- Explain and R- Referral Some of the interventions were on: sexual education; prevent injuries and violence; enhance mental health; prevent substance abuse; and addressing non-communicable diseases.



He said that Agency for Sustainable Development Initiatives is a registered Non-Governmental Organization, established since 2003 which deals mainly with the social works and social issues concerning society. He also said that the organization was established with a mission to improve the quality of life of the most vulnerable sections of society, particularly those residing in remote rural communities.

Some of the different projects that was highlighted during the orientation programme were: Synod Sepngi Training Institute Cum Production Centre (SSTICPC); Mairang Vidyajyoti Inclusive School (Vidya – Learning/Knowledge, Jyoti – Light); Community Based Rehabilitation Programme, Mairang; Rev. S. Wollington Children's Home at Nongpyndeng, Nongstoin; Rev. S. Wollington Aftercare Home; Rev. Amirkha School for Disabled at Mawlai; Synod Sepngi Mobile Health Clinic; Livelihood Projects; Intergrated Farming System, and Wall of Kindness.



He highlighted on NHM which was launched by the Government of India in 2013 and also orient the students about the goals of NRHM which are: Reduction in infant mortality rate & Maternal Mortality Ratio by at least 50% from existing existing levels in next seven years; Universalize access to Public Health Services for women's health, child health, water, hygiene, sanitation and nutrition; Prevention and control of communicable and noncommunicable diseases, including locally endemic diseases; Access to integrated comprehensive primary healthcare; Ensuring population stabilization, gender and demographic balance; Revitalize local health traditions and mainstream AYUSH; and Promotion of healthy life styles.

The Virtual Organization Orientation Programme was organized by the Department of Social Work- PG, St. Edmund's College, Shillong, for the students of first semester studying Masters in Social Work.
