12. OUTCOME OF THE PROGRAMME:

The webinar was thematic and meant primarily for students from the departments of Economics, Political Science, Sociology and Social Work. Prof. B. Mishra, with numerous publications and years of experience in the area of Public Economics, was able to reach out in a subtle way to students across disciplines. Moving through a timeline and explaining the crucial roles of both Market and Government across the world, meandering through meanings of Physiocracy, Laissez-faire, Mercantilism, Capitalism to explaining the causes behind the Great Depression, supported with empirical studies, kept the participants deeply engrossed for a little over 2 hours. Prof Mishra answered plenty of questions and also shared his views on the role of Government in Meghalaya. The key takeaways were:

- Deeper understanding of the principles underlying the Classical Theories of Growth
- Situations necessitating Government intervention
- Importance of infrastructure development
- Development Hindrances in Meghalaya
