REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION, 8TH MARCH 2021

Introduction

International Women's Day is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. Significant activity is witnessed worldwide as groups come together to celebrate women's achievements or rally for women's equality.

Marked annually on March 8th, International Women's Day (IWD) is one of the most important days of the year to celebrate women's achievements, raise awareness about women's equality, lobby for accelerated gender parity, fundraise for female-focused charities.

Programme Schedule

Detail of the programme

The programme started with a welcome speech by Ms. Christie M. Kharmyndai, MSW 1st Semester student. She welcomed all the participants on behalf of the Department. The welcome speech was followed by a speech from Dr. Sylvanus Lamare, Principal, St. Edmund's College. He spoke about the role of women and the effort put by the women during Covid -19. He thanked all the staff especially the non teaching staff of the college for all their hard work especially during the pandemic. The principal also appreciated all the women front line workers during the pandemic. To make us more understand the principal highlighted about women in our society. He mentioned about the three pillars that work hand in hand:

The speech by the Principal was followed by a short speech by the Coordinator of IQAC Bro. Simon Coelho *cfc*. Appreciating women on this day he thanked his mother for giving him life, he thanked all the female non teaching staff (Kongs) for working very hard to keep the college campus clean.

After the speech of the Coordinator of IQAC Br. Simon Coelho, the MSW First Semester boys presented a song that they had composed dedicated to all the women. The song highlighted and appreciated the spirit of women. The song was followed by a short message from the Vice Principal, Mr. Monotosh Chakraborty. In his speech he stressed on the role of women in the society and shared a story of how he prepared breakfast for his wife in the morning to appreciate the work and contributions that she has made for the family as well as for the society.
