Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice

A Legacy of Courage and Compassion

Born in Callan, Ireland, in 1762, Edmund Ignatius Rice was blessed with comfort in a land where religious persecution had reduced many to poverty and despair.

At seventeen, he left his family farm to apprentice under his uncle, a wealthy merchant in Waterford. Success followed swiftly, and by twenty-five, he was married to Mary Elliott.

But tragedy struck Mary died just two years later, leaving behind their physically challenged daughter, whom Edmund cherished and cared for throughout his life.

Deeply spiritual and driven by a profound sense of justice, Edmund was torn between a life of monastic prayer and active service. Inspired by a friend's words and the selfless work of the Presentation Sisters, he knew his true calling, to uplift the poor, especially the youth, through education.

In 1802, with unwavering faith, he sold his thriving business and, alone, transformed a humble stable into a school for the destitute of Waterford. His boldness drew others to his cause, giving birth to the Congregation of Christian Brothers. Facing relentless trials, he trusted entirely in Divine Providence, dedicating himself to defending the poor, advocating for justice, and bringing hope to the forgotten.

On August 29, 1844, he passed into eternity, leaving behind a movement that continues to change lives. Today, his Brothers serve in over 400 foundations across 30 countries. On May 5, 1995, Edmund Ignatius Rice was beatified, a lasting testament to his holiness and enduring mission. His spirit lives on in every act of love, service, and education inspired by his extraordinary life.




St. Edmund's College

A History of Excellence and Transformation

Founded on a vision of education that transforms, St. Edmund's College, Shillong, has been a beacon of excellence, values, and holistic education for over a century. The Christian Brothers arrived in Shillong in 1915, laying the foundation for St. Edmund's School in 1916. Seven years later, in 1923, the University Section was born, offering Inter-Arts and Inter-Science courses affiliated with Calcutta University. From these humble beginnings, the College has grown into one of North East India's premier institutions, shaping generations of leaders, thinkers, and changemakers.


Over the years, St. Edmund's has continually evolved, expanding its academic offerings to 22 undergraduate and one postgraduate course. It has produced eminent personalities in politics, medicine, engineering, academia, and public service—trailblazers who embody its ethos of integrity, excellence, and service.

Assessed and accredited by NAAC in four cycles—2003, 2009, 2019, and 2024—the College continues to set benchmarks in higher education. In 2015, it achieved a historic milestone, becoming the first and only college in Eastern India to be awarded STAR STATUS by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, recognizing its exceptional programs in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, and Zoology.



The momentum continued in 2016, when STAR Funding was extended to Computer Science, Electronics, Environmental Science, and Mathematics, reinforcing the College's standing as a center of scientific excellence.

Furthering its commitment to cutting-edge research and innovation, St. Edmund's hosts an active research center in Biotech Hub and a Bioinformatics Centre, both funded by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. These hubs foster a culture of discovery, providing students and faculty with the resources to pioneer breakthroughs in science and technology.



At St. Edmund's, education is not just about learning—it is about pushing boundaries, exploring new frontiers, and contributing to the world of knowledge with passion and purpose. Beyond academics, the College nurtures the holistic development of its students, fostering discipline, creativity, and social responsibility. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- Applicants who have appeared for CUET UG 2025 will be given first preference during admissions.
- The remaining seats will be filled through an entrance test and based on marks obtained in the Class 12 examination.
- Applicants, parents, and guardians should refer to the College Prospectus before applying.
- Applicants seeking admission to St. Edmund's College should seek provisional selection by submitting their CUET UG Application Form starting from March 10 2025, at: <https://secv4.linways.com/v4/adm-applicant/login>.
- After the declaration of the Class 12 result, Applicants can seek final selection by uploading their Class 12 marksheet and submitting their preferences for the major subject.
- Selected candidates will receive a confirmation e-mail. The selected candidates will forfeit their admission if their fees are not paid within 48 hours of the intimation.
- State Reservation Policy as approved by the Sponsoring Body, will be in place.
- Candidates of the Congregation of Christian Brothers, other Catholic Religious Congregations, and Seminarians shall be given direct admission, subject to their fulfilling the minimum University criteria for admission in the respective stream/subjects.
- The Secretary of the College Governing Body, supported by the Principal and the two Vice Principals will be directly responsible for all admissions.
- The Management reserves the right to grant or not grant admission. It also reserves the right to refuse an application for admission without assigning any reasons for the same.
- The College cannot bear any responsibility for an applicant who does not have the University required norms and through oversight has been admitted to the course.
- In case of withdrawal of admission, fees shall be refunded as per the UGC instruction D.O. No. F.2-71/2022(CPP-II) dated 3rd July 2023. A candidate seeking a refund must apply for it stating a reason for withdrawal and no re-admission will be granted.

DOCUMENTS FOR APPLICATION

(a) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE APPLICATION FOR PROVISIONAL SELECTION:

- (i) A copy of a recent passport-size photograph of the applicant.
- (ii) A copy of the Class X marksheet.
- (iii) A copy of the CUET Application form.
- (iv) A copy of the Aadhar card (in case the applicant does not possess one, kindly obtain the same before the session starts)
- (v) A copy of the ST certificate for Meghalaya Tribal applicants (if applicable).

Note: On provisional selection, applicants will be offered a Computer assisted self-learning course to prepare for CUET UG preparation.

(b) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE APPLICATION FOR FINAL SELECTION :

- (i) A copy of the Class XII marksheet.
- (ii) A copy of the CUET UG 2025 marksheet. (in case the applicant has not received the CUET UG 2025 marksheet, kindly upload the same before the session starts)

Note: Online Application without the required documents will not be considered.

(c) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THE COLLEGE OFFICE FOR UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION:

- (a) Hard copy of the College Application Form.
- (b) A self-attested copy of the marksheet of Class X.
- (c) A self-attested copy of the marksheet of Class XII.
- (d) A self-attested copy of the CUET UG 2025 marksheet.
- (e) A self-attested ST/SC/OBC certificate (if applicable).
- (f) The ORIGINAL Gap certificate issued by a competent authority (applicable for applicants who have a gap of one or more years)

- (g) A Character Certificate from the Principal of the School / College last attended.
- (h) The ORIGINAL Transfer Certificate from the School / College last attended.
- (i) The ORIGINAL Migration Certificate for applicants coming from Boards / Universities other than the Meghalaya Board Of School Education is to be handed over to the office not later than one month from the date of commencement of the First Semester.
- (j) The College encourages applicants with disabilities to enroll. Such applicants are required to produce a Disability Certificate duly issued by a competent authority.

Note:

- The ORIGINAL marksheet of Class X and XII is NOT to be handed to the office under any circumstances.
- Applicants who do not have all the required documents will not be able to register for University Examinations.

ADMISSION OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

The College has, over the years, drawn students from various foreign countries such as Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Malaysia, Myanmar, Thailand, Korea, Vietnam, Finland, Afghanistan and other countries. This is a matter of immense pride to us, and we hope to draw ever-increasing numbers of students from around the world as this enhances the cosmopolitan culture of the campus. Both the students and the institution benefit from exposure to different people and different cultures.

The College charges the same fees from foreign students as in the case of the Indian students. Foreign students are given preference in admission to the College Hostels.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS:

- Foreign students should have all legal documents such as visas and permissions for entry into the country. The student will have to produce the documents when applying.

- The applicant should have equivalence certification given by the Indian Embassies in their countries signed on their Higher Secondary equivalent examination results.
- On gaining Provisional admission to the course of studies of their choice, applicants are to apply to the Association of Indian Universities (AIU House, 16, Comrade Indrajit Gupta Marg [Kotla Marg], New Delhi 110002) for issuance of an equivalence certificate as the same is required by the North-Eastern Hill University before students can be registered in the University.
- Applicants will be provisionally admitted to the respective courses until the North-Eastern Hill University issues the Registration Cards for them.
- The College Office (Counter No.4) will provide all assistance possible to students in this matter.

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020

COURSES OF STUDY

- The College conducts undergraduate courses which are affiliated to North-Eastern Hill University in Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Commerce, Bachelor of Social Work and Bachelor of Computer Applications. The College will follow the North-Eastern Hill University norms as guidelines.
- The duration of the Degree Course is eight semesters which is equivalent to 4 years.
- The College holds semester examinations as per the University schedule. After the completion of each semester, the student continues in the next semester after due registration.
- The Degree courses in the College are full-time courses. There are no provisions for “Private” or “Part-Time” or “Non-collegiate candidates”.

MAJOR SUBJECT

The Major subject is a discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits through core courses in the major discipline.

BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK (B.S.W.)

Kindly note that the course demands students to be engaged in Field Work two days each week and hence, they have to be in good health and ready to face challenges. On being selected the candidate will have to produce a medical fitness certificate from a Government-registered practitioner within two weeks of the commencement of the First Semester session.

The Weekly Field Work, a Rural Camp (in the third semester), and a Study Tour (in the sixth semester) are integral to the course. Students must contribute to associated costs, including teacher supervision, teacher travel, and related expenses. The semester college fee does not cover expenses for field trips, rural camps, or study tours; these costs will be determined based on actual expenses incurred.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY COURSES (MDC)

MDCs are introductory-level courses/papers intended to broaden the intellectual experience & conceptual understanding of students within and beyond different

disciplines. Students shall be qualified for the 4-year Bachelor's degrees on successful completion of 9-Credit MDC.

Students need to choose their MDC paper one week after the commencement of the first semester using the LINWAYS portal on a first come first serve basis from the following options:

1. **MDC 110 Commercial Arithmetic & Elementary Statistics** – The course will familiarize students with knowledge of essential mathematics & statistics that are applicable to real-life business situations.
2. **MDC 111 Culture & Society** – The course will examine concepts & theories related to culture along with understanding the socio-cultural diversity of India & North-East India.
3. **MDC 112 Fundamentals of Computer Systems** – The course will involve comprehension of basic information related to hardware & software, number systems, types of operating systems and networks.
4. **MDC 113 Fundamentals of Earth System Science** – The course provides comprehensive knowledge about planet Earth, geological processes and the formation of minerals & rocks.
5. **MDC 114 Fundamentals of Lifelong Learning** – The course will examine concepts & related terms of Lifelong learning and its relevance in the present-day context. It also focuses on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and throws light on government programmes on lifelong learning for youth, women, farmers, etc.
6. **MDC 115 Introductory Life Sciences** – The course aims to familiarize students with concepts of Biodiversity & Importance of Wildlife and conservation, the Origin of life, General Diversity & Classification of Life Forms, the process of evolution, Genes and their role in inheritance.
7. **MDC 117 Introduction to Psychology** – The course will identify basic concepts of psychology and apply psychological principles to everyday life. It will examine the relationship between the physical functioning of an organism and its behaviour and pro-social behaviour.

8. **MDC 118 Mathematics in Daily Life** – The course will familiarize students with everyday banking transactions, and data interpretation. Students will be able to perform basic calculations & measurements and also understand ratios and proportions.
9. **MDC 119 Philosophy of Culture** – The course will impart the basics of human culture and help develop core concepts of cultural understanding of knowledge & society. It will incorporate belief systems, tribal cultures from NE-India and Indian Culture, along with a focus on the decolonization of knowledge & culture & cultural nationalism.

SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC)

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students.

Students need to choose their SEC paper one week after the commencement of the first semester using the LINWAYS portal on a first come first serve basis from the following options:

1. **SEC- 130: Cyber Security-** This course will help students with various security concepts and how to apply them in daily cyber use. Perform the malware and spam email identification, analysis, virus scanning and cleaning and other services using security tools and various existing cyber laws.
2. **SEC- 131: Motivation-** This course will demonstrate different aspects on how people are motivated, value outcomes through improved performance, well-being, personal growth and a sense of purpose, propose a pathway to change the way of thinking, feeling and behaving and also willing to work with zeal, initiative, interest and enthusiasm.
3. **SEC-132: Personality Development** – This course will comprehend the scope of personality and its development, enable development of core skills for development of self, understand positive personality traits, Cultivating skills

for successful life

4. SEC-133: Public Speaking- The course will enable the students to overcome the fear of public speaking and enhance their confidence to gain practical experience in effective public speaking
5. SEC-134: Team Building- This course will help students to understand the importance of team building, its purpose, team spirit and teamwork. They will be able to effectively address diverse issues relating to team building processes. The students will learn how team building helps in conflict resolution, management and the use of individual talents.

ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AEC)

These courses are designed to help students enhance their skills in communication, language, and personality development. The students will gain awareness of the various artistic expressions emerging out of diverse literary and cultural experiences. The students will also gain the ability to communicate ideals opinions and values and apply the knowledge of the subject to real-life situations.

Students need to choose their AEC paper one week after the commencement of the first semester using the LINWAYS portal from the following options:

1. AEC-120 –ALTERNATIVE ENGLISH
2. AEC-124 – MIL-I: KA LITERESHOR KHASI BAD KA KYLLA-KTIEN

VALUE ADDED COURSES (VAC)

Value-Added courses are part of the curriculum designed to provide necessary skills to increase the employability quotient and equip the students with essential skills to succeed in life.

In Semester I, VAC (140) Environmental Science is compulsory.

- The fees mentioned in the above table will be charged for 6 semesters. A separate fee schedule applies to fourth year (semesters 7 and 8) students which will be notified in due time.
- Should the situation so demand, the fees may be marginally changed even during the semester.
- During Admission, all candidates will pay a fee of Rs. 15,000. The balance fee of the first semester should be paid by 31st August 2025. Fees for subsequent semesters are to be paid in ONE installment.
- Should a student decide to leave the college at any time of the session or be expelled from the college, he / she shall be liable to pay the outstanding amount of the “fees payable” for the given Semester.
- Any student whose name has been struck off the register may be readmitted at

the discretion of the Principal, on payment of arrears and fines in full.

- The Governing Body of the College, in the year 2002, decided to charge a College Fee, in response to the Government's letter to Colleges: No. EDN/136/98/466 dt. 2nd November 2001, freeing Colleges to enhance fees to meet the payment to non Government-sanction staff of the College. It is also meant to meet the need of the College to employ additional Staff (teaching, Office and non-teaching) when required. Kindly note that the College Fees could be enhanced each year.

COLLEGE HOSTELS

- The College also maintains hostel facilities for the benefit of out-station students who come from other states and countries as well.
- The College currently has a Boys' Hostel (Bro. J. N. Foley Hostel) with a capacity of 50 students and a Girls' Hostel accommodating 30 students.
- Those wishing to apply for a Hostel seat may purchase the Hostel Prospectus from the Rector's Office after admission into the College and submit the form enclosed.
- While meeting the Rector, the applicant should be accompanied by her/his parent (s) and the local Guardian.
- Hostel admission is provided on the basis of merit.
- The pupils are expected to maintain discipline and a feeling of fraternity with one another in the hostel and the community at large.

ATTENDANCE

- According to UGC Regulations, a student requires a minimum of 75% Attendance. A student having less than the required percentage of attendance is liable to be barred from appearing for the University Examinations.
- For better communication, a student from outside Shillong must have a local Guardian and they will have to come to the College when they are called.

ANTI-RAGGING

Ragging of freshers / juniors in many institutions is a matter of social concern. Ragging in any form (Physical, Verbal and Mental) is totally prohibited in this institution.

Anyone found guilty of ragging and / or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively is liable to be punished in accordance with the “UGC Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”. Every student is expected to register online in the Anti-Ragging Cell under UGC and submit a copy of the Undertaking Registration form to their respective Department Heads.

Our institution is free from ragging. However, there is an Anti-Ragging Cell in place, comprising senior students and teachers in-charge. Members of this cell are always vigilant that no ragging to freshers / juniors occurs in the College Campus or Hostels. Hostel wardens are empowered to take action against students indulging in ragging as per the UGC regulations.
