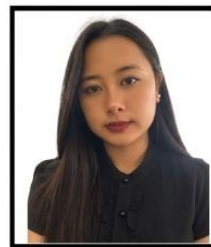

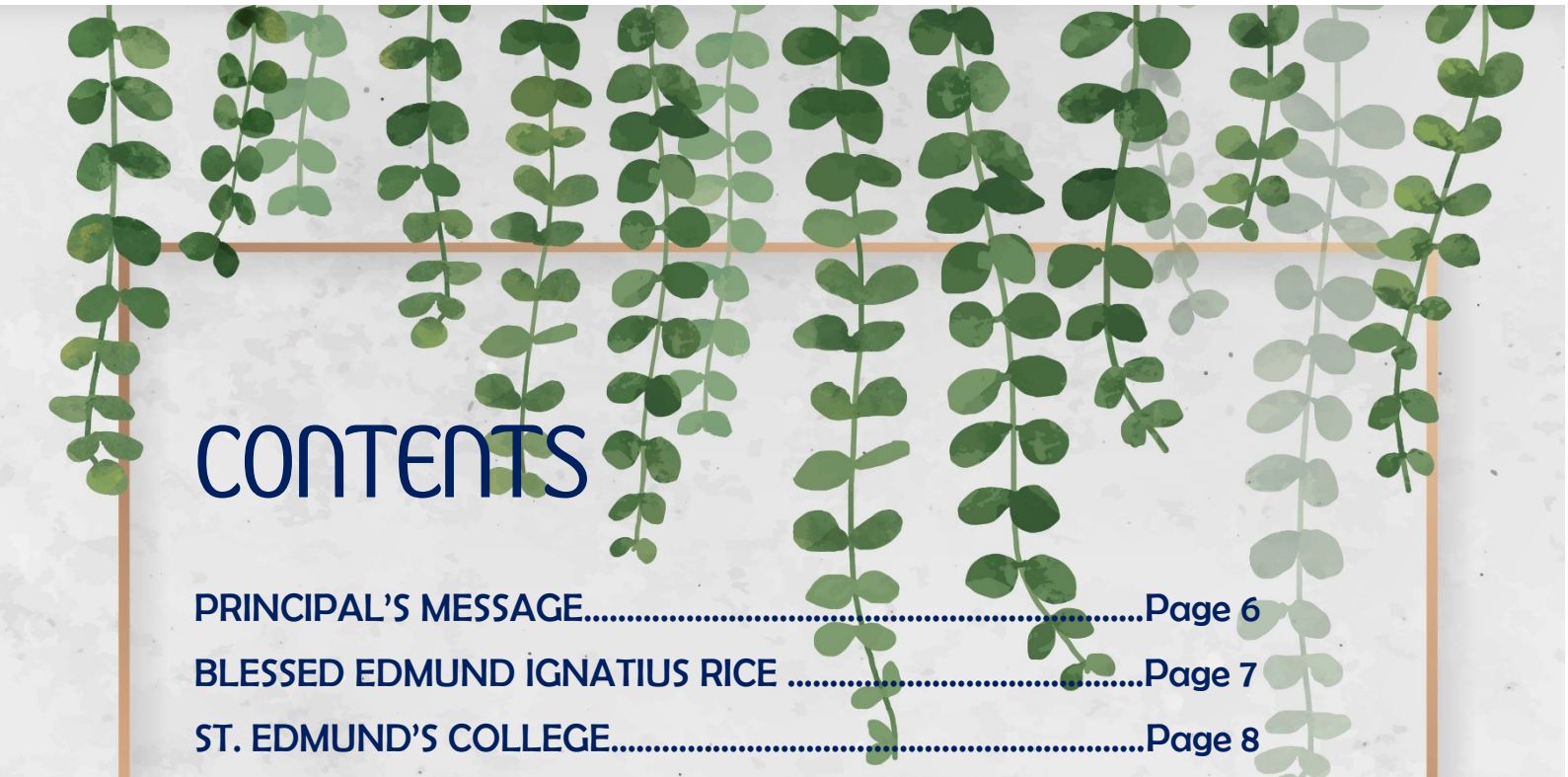

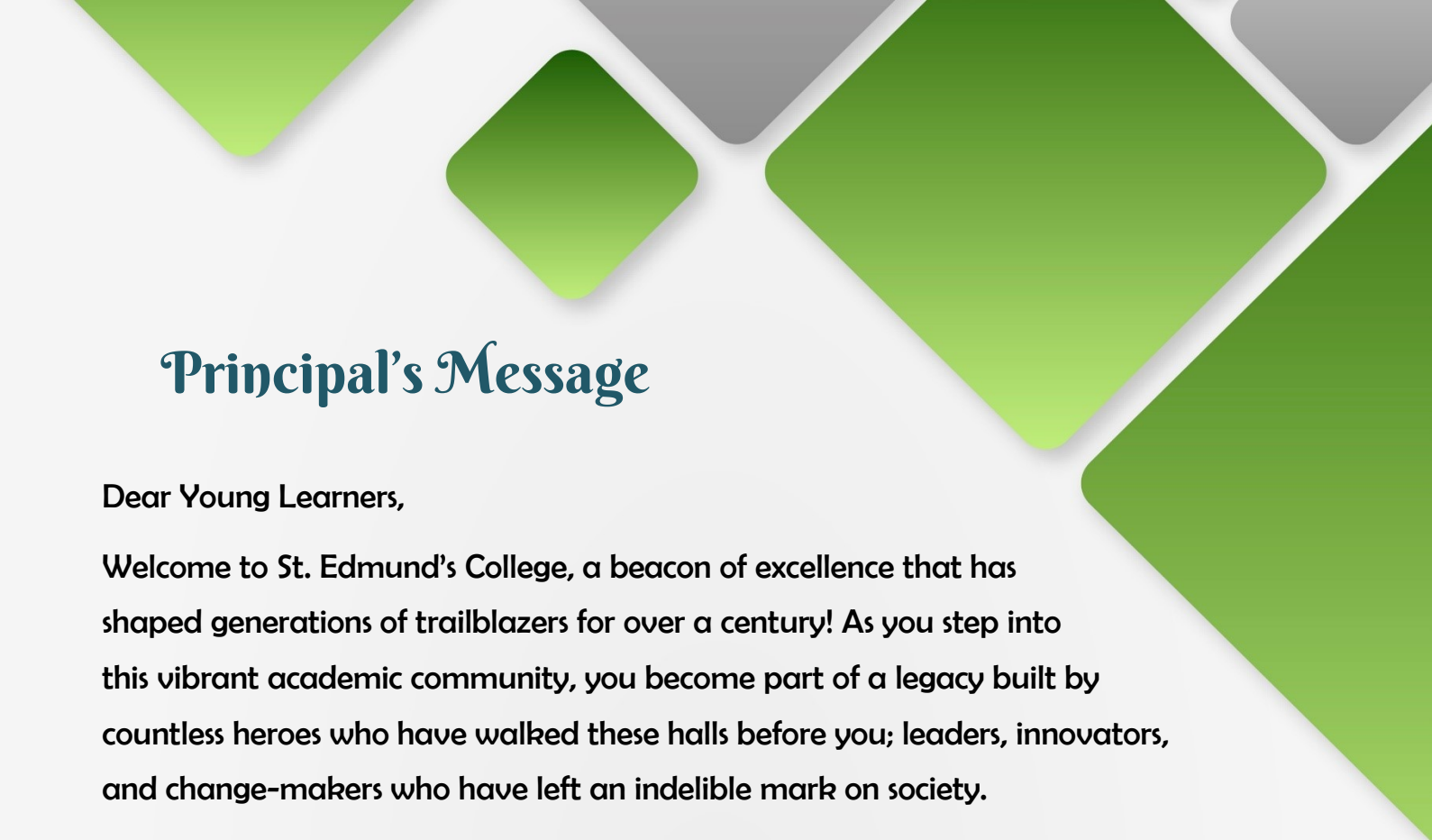

Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice

A Legacy of Courage and Compassion

Born in Callan, Ireland, in 1762, Edmund Ignatius Rice was blessed with comfort in a land where religious persecution had reduced many to poverty and despair.

At seventeen, he left his family farm to apprentice under his uncle, a wealthy merchant in Waterford. Success followed swiftly, and by twenty-five, he was married to Mary Elliott.

But tragedy struck Mary died just two years later, leaving behind their physically challenged daughter, whom Edmund cherished and cared for throughout his life.

Deeply spiritual and driven by a profound sense of justice, Edmund was torn between a life of monastic prayer and active service. Inspired by a friend's words and the selfless work of the Presentation Sisters, he knew his true calling, to uplift the poor, especially the youth, through education.

In 1802, with unwavering faith, he sold his thriving business and, alone, transformed a humble stable into a school for the destitute of Waterford. His boldness drew others to his cause, giving birth to the Congregation of Christian Brothers. Facing relentless trials, he trusted entirely in Divine Providence, dedicating himself to defending the poor, advocating for justice, and bringing hope to the forgotten.

On August 29, 1844, he passed into eternity, leaving behind a movement that continues to change lives. Today, his Brothers serve in over 400 foundations across 30 countries. On May 5, 1995, Edmund Ignatius Rice was beatified, a lasting testament to his holiness and enduring mission. His spirit lives on in every act of love, service, and education inspired by his extraordinary life.





St. Edmund's College

A History of Excellence and Transformation

Founded on a vision of education that transforms, St. Edmund's College, Shillong, has been a beacon of excellence, values, and holistic education for over a century. The Christian Brothers arrived in Shillong in 1915, laying the foundation for St. Edmund's School in 1916. Seven years later, in 1923, the University Section was born, offering Inter-Arts and Inter-Science courses affiliated with Calcutta University. From these humble beginnings, the College has grown into one of North East India's premier institutions, shaping generations of leaders, thinkers, and changemakers.

Over the years, St. Edmund's has continually evolved, expanding its academic offerings to 22 undergraduate and one postgraduate course. It has produced eminent personalities in politics, medicine, engineering, academia, and public service—trailblazers who embody its ethos of integrity, excellence, and service.

Assessed and accredited by NAAC in four cycles—2003, 2009, 2019, and 2024—the College continues to set benchmarks in higher education. In 2015, it achieved a historic milestone, becoming the first and only college in Eastern India to be awarded STAR STATUS by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, recognizing its exceptional programs in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, and Zoology.





The momentum continued in 2016, when STAR Funding was extended to Computer Science, Electronics, Environmental Science, and Mathematics, reinforcing the College's standing as a center of scientific excellence.

Furthering its commitment to cutting-edge research and innovation, St. Edmund's hosts an active research center in Biotech Hub and a Bioinformatics Centre, both funded by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. These hubs foster a culture of discovery, providing students and faculty with the resources to pioneer breakthroughs in science and technology.



At St. Edmund's, education is not just about learning—it is about pushing boundaries, exploring new frontiers, and contributing to the world of knowledge with passion and purpose. Beyond academics, the College nurtures the holistic development of its students, fostering discipline, creativity, and social responsibility. Here, students are empowered to imagine, innovate, and inspire, living out the College motto: “Facta Non Verba” (Deeds, Not Words).



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Applicants who have appeared for CUET PG 2026 will be given first preference during admissions.
2. The remaining seats will be filled through an interview and based on marks obtained in the Degree examination.
3. Applicants, parents, and guardians should refer to the PG College Prospectus 2026 before applying.
4. Selected candidates will receive a confirmation e-mail. The selected candidates will forfeit their admission if their fees are not paid within 48 hours of the intimation.
5. State Reservation Policy as approved by the Sponsoring Body, will be in place.
6. Candidates of the Congregation of Christian Brothers, other Catholic Religious Congregations, and Seminarians shall be given direct admission, subject to their fulfilling the minimum University criteria for admission in the respective stream/subjects.
7. The Secretary of the College Governing Body, supported by the Principal and the Vice Principal (Academics) will be directly responsible for all admissions.
8. The Management reserves the right to grant or not grant admission. It also reserves the right to refuse an application for admission without assigning any reasons for the same.
9. The College cannot bear any responsibility for an applicant who does not have the University required norms and through oversight has been admitted to the course.
10. In case of withdrawal of admission, fees shall be refunded as per the UGC Refund Policy.

DOCUMENTS FOR APPLICATION

(a) SCANNED DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE APPLICATION:

- (i) Recent passport-size photograph of the applicant.
- (ii) Class 10 marksheet.
- (iii) Class 12 marksheet.

- (iv) A copy of the Degree marksheets.
- (v) A copy of the CUET PG score sheet (if applicable).
- (vi) A copy of the Aadhar card (in case the applicant does not possess one, kindly obtain the same before the session starts)
- (vii) A copy of the ST certificate for Meghalaya Tribal applicants (if applicable).

Note: Online Application without the required documents will not be considered.

(b) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THE COLLEGE OFFICE FOR UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION (to be collected on the start of the session):

- (a) Hard copy of the College Application Form.
- (b) A self-attested copy of the Class 10 marksheet.
- (c) A self-attested copy of the Class 12 marksheet.
- (i) A self-attested copy of the Degree marksheets.
- (d) A self-attested copy of the CUET PG 2026 marksheet (if applicable).
- (e) A self-attested ST/SC/OBC certificate (if applicable).
- (f) A copy of the Aadhaar card.
- (g) The ORIGINAL Gap certificate issued by a competent authority (applicable for applicants who have a gap of one or more years)
- (h) A Character Certificate from the Principal of the University / College last attended.
- (i) The ORIGINAL Transfer Certificate from the University / College last attended.
- (j) The ORIGINAL Migration Certificate is to be handed over to the office not later than one month from the date of commencement of the First Semester.

Note:

- The ORIGINAL marksheets are NOT to be handed to the office under any circumstances.
- Applicants who do not have all the required documents will not be able to register for University Examinations.

ADMISSION OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

The College has, over the years, drawn students from various foreign countries such as Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Malaysia, Myanmar, Thailand, Korea, Vietnam, Finland, Afghanistan and other countries. This is a matter of immense pride to us, and we hope to draw ever-increasing numbers of students from around the world as this enhances the cosmopolitan culture of the campus. Both the students and the institution benefit from exposure to different people and different cultures.

The College charges the same fees from foreign students as in the case of the Indian students. Foreign students are given preference in admission to the College Hostels.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS:

- Foreign students need to produce a copy of the valid passport when applying. They should have all legal documents such as visas and permissions for entry into the country when they report to College for classes.
- The applicant should have equivalence certification given by the Indian Embassies in their countries signed on their Degree equivalent examination results.
- On gaining Provisional admission to the course of studies of their choice, applicants are to apply to the Association of Indian Universities (AIU House, 16, Comrade Indrajit Gupta Marg [Kotla Marg], New Delhi 110002) for issuance of an equivalence certificate as the same is required by the North-Eastern Hill University before students can be registered in the University.
- Applicants will be provisionally admitted to the respective courses until the North-Eastern Hill University issues the Registration Cards for them.
- The College Office will provide all assistance possible to students in this matter.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The MSW programme is spread over four semesters across two academic years, with a total of 22 courses. Each course carries 4 credits, and the programme also includes a dissertation component of 20 credits, covering proposal development, research execution, analysis, and report submission.

The total credit requirement for the successful completion of the programme is 104 credits.

SPECIALIZATION

To support focused professional development, students undertake concentration papers in the third and fourth semesters. The programme offers specialization in:

- Community Organization and Development Practice
- Family and Child Welfare

These concentrations enable students to develop domain-specific knowledge and practice competencies relevant to professional social work settings.

- During Admission, all candidates will pay a fee of Rs. 15,000. The balance fee of the first semester should be paid by 30th November 2026.
- Fees for subsequent semesters are to be paid in TWO equal installments.
- University Exam Fees are NOT included in the Fees mentioned in the table above. It will have to be cleared by the student before his/her respective semester exam.
- Should the situation so demand, the fees may be marginally changed even during the semester.
- Should a student decide to leave the college at any time of the session or be expelled from the college, he / she shall be liable to pay the outstanding amount of the “fees payable” for the given Semester.
- Any student whose name has been struck off the register may be readmitted at the discretion of the Principal, on payment of arrears and fines in full.
- NEHU Top Ten Merit List candidates are entitled to 20% fee concession for the first semester. From the second semester onwards, the top student(s) in aggregate marks will be entitled to 20% fee concession.

- The Governing Body of the College, in the year 2002, decided to charge a College Fee, in response to the Government's letter to Colleges: No. EDN/136/98/466 dt. 2nd November 2001, freeing Colleges to enhance fees to meet the payment to non Government-sanction staff of the College. It is also meant to meet the need of the College to employ additional Staff (teaching, Office and non-teaching) when required. Kindly note that the College Fees could be enhanced each year.
- All College Fees, Fines, etc. have to be paid online on the Linways portal.

 - b) Click on Student Login
 - c) Enter your credentials.
 - d) Click on "My Fees" and then make the payment for the respective semester.

LOCAL GUARDIANS

All outstation students (outside the city of Shillong) must have a registered local guardian.

WHO QUALIFIES AS A LOCAL GUARDIAN

- Must be nominated and authenticated by the student's parent or natural guardian
- Must be a responsible adult, at least 25 years of age
- Must reside within Shillong city

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

At the time of admission, outstation students must submit a Local Guardian Registration Form containing:

- Full name, address, and contact details of the local guardian
- Relationship with the student
- Photo ID proof of the local guardian (Aadhaar card recommended)
- A change in the local guardian (or contact details) requires re-registration

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LOCAL GUARDIAN

The local guardian is expected to:

- Act as the primary emergency contact when parents are unreachable
- Attend parent-teacher meetings if called by the college
- Be available to receive the student during emergencies, illness
- Co-sign official documents (leave applications, outing permissions) when required

COLLEGE HOSTELS

- The College also maintains hostel facilities for the benefit of out-station students who come from other states and countries as well.
- The Boys' Hostel has a capacity of 36 boarders with double-occupancy rooms. The Girls' Hostel has a capacity of 42 boarders with double-occupancy rooms.
- Those wishing to apply for a Hostel seat may purchase the Hostel Application Form from the Rector's Office after admission into the College and submit the form.
- Hostel admission is provided on the basis of merit.
- The pupils are expected to maintain discipline and a feeling of fraternity with one another in the hostel and the community at large.

ATTENDANCE

- According to UGC Regulations, a student requires a minimum of 75% Attendance. A student having less than the required percentage of attendance is liable to be barred from appearing for the University Examinations.
- For better communication, a student from outside Shillong must have a local Guardian and they will have to come to the College when they are called.

ANTI-RAGGING

Ragging in any form (Physical, Verbal and Mental) is totally prohibited in the college and there is an Anti-Ragging Cell in place. Members of this cell are always vigilant that no ragging to freshers / juniors occurs in the College Campus or College Hostels. College Hostel wardens are to immediately report any incident of ragging to the Management. The Principal of the College shall act immediately in response to the information received from the Anti-Ragging Cell/ College Hostel wardens.

Anyone found guilty of ragging and / or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively is liable to be punished in accordance with the “UGC Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”.
