

About the Programme:

The Department of Electronics along with UBA, conducted a Three Days Outreach Program from the 29th to 31th of March 2022, for 2 schools adopted as part of **UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)** on **"HANDS-ON BASIC ELECTRONICS AND CIRCUIT DESIGNING ON BREAD BOARDS"** under DBT Star College Scheme.

The Plan was to conduct the program in a "**DO AND LEARN**" manner for three consecutive days with the 4th and 6th semester students as instructors. Each day would have two sessions and each session would be of two hours duration. There would be a break of one hour between two sessions.

Two Schools from Mylliem agreed to be a part of the program with their Class IX and X students. The schools are RAM KRISHNA MISSION SECONDARY SCHOOL MYLLIEM having 26 students and MYLLIEM PRESBYTERIAN HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL having 28 students. The Students from Electronics Dept were accordingly divided into two groups.

Title: Kitchen Garden

About the Programme:

The objectives for the kitchen garden are to plant nutritional vegetables easy to maintain in kitchen garden for the children and to educate and inform the children on the various nutritional advantages and benefits of vegetables.

Materials used for the kitchen garden are Thermacool boxes, vegetable roots and seeds, soil and manure, bamboo. Roots Planted are Beetroot, Brocolli, Cherry Tomato and Lettuce. The field for getting the manure was far away from the residential area of the village. There is a bamboo grove situated ahead of the Secretary's (Mr. S. Nongkhlaw) house where the volunteers bought the bamboo for the fences. The children watered and took care of the plants when the volunteers were not present.

State schemes are State rice, Organic manure scheme, Vegetable development scheme, Fruit development scheme, Tuber crop, and Agriculture marketing to name a few. Among the Central schemes, she mainly spoke about National food security mission (NFSM), Rashtriya krishi vikas Yojana(RKVJ), National mission for sustainable agriculture(NMSA), Soil health card schemes, Pradhan mantri kisan Samman Nidhi(PM KISAN) and Kisan Credit Card Scheme.

The Resource Person Dr. Karen Syiem spoke about being a teen mom is a risk factor for depression, higher risk of complications during pregnancy, the father of the child would fall under the POCSO Act.
