About the programme: On the 10th of September the UBA Volunteers had a meeting with the Village Headman regarding the water sources in the village. The following are some of the information collected during the meeting:

Water Sources in Mawthawtieng village

- 1. **Wahlalieh**: At present the village has 2 water sources at Wahlalieh. Initially it was dug manually but later these water sources was convert into cemented spring chamber with MGNREG Scheme.
- 2. **Wah pukri**: There is only one water source in wahpukri and 3 water tanks that was given from the MDC scheme, the MGNREG Scheme and scheme from the Block.

These above water sources would be able to supply water During summer season

3. **Lum umthli (Demmiewsohiong)**: this water source was about 3 and half kilometers from the village. It has only one tanky there to collect the water as to connect the pipe for supplying the water to the village. The village got the scheme for this water source from the PHE. They also got two water tanks from the same scheme. But from this water source only ¼ of the villagers benefitted from it.

The difficulty in getting water from this source for the whole village is that the water source is situated below while the village is ¼ of its villagers resides below and the rest resides above. There is no machine to pump the water as to supply to the rest of the villagers who resides above the water source.

During summer even the villagers who resides below the water source could not get water from this source as the pipe was destroyed due to landslide and the villagers had to repair every time.

The village Headman had identified that this source is reliable to get water even during winter if they only get the necessary things that they would be able to supply water to the whole village.

Ponds: the village has two ponds situated at wahlalieh which is on top of the hill. The main purpose of these ponds is to collect rain water.

Therefore the village faces Scarcity of water during the winter seasons.

About the programme:

The Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) is a set of methods and techniques that development practitioners use in the field to be able to collect data and information rapidly. It is an approach where it brings reliable data within a short span of time. It also enables to get closer to the community which makes way to plan in a participatory mode using the data given by the villagers.

Site of PRA study

The Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) was conducted in Mawthawtieng Village, Laitkhroh Kharatshnong C & RD Block of East Khasi Hills District and located 48km from its headquater Shillong. The village road (pucca) connectivity is available till the village where as the road connectivity inside the village is Katcha road. Despite abundant land resources, road connectivity and availability of water sources yet the village faced difficulty in getting water during the winter season which lasted for four to five months. Keeping in view the above facts, an exercise of finding out village problems and learn the situation of the village in a better way was undertaken through the Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) technique.

Objectives

To make local people capable for critical analysis and assessment of their situation.

To ensure people's participation in appraising the situation.

Methodology Adopted

At the initial stage of the Participatory Rural Appraisal a short meeting was conducted of the village of the village headman Mr. Lamphrang Nongrum and Mr. Kamai Khongian along with Mr. Randolph Langstieh, the resource person and Mr. Tenny Mukhim, the Technical Assistant. It was in this short meeting that the problem of the village was discussed. The village headman was also informed about the meeting (PRA) to be held in the village. The date and time for conducting the PRA were fixed in consultation with the village headman and all the villagers were requested to participate in the meeting.

On the 28th of October 2022 the Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) exercise was held in the village in which Mr. Randolph Langstieh was the resource person. There were about 35 men and women, few youths and also

school children present in the PRA exercise. The PRA exercise started with few questions made by the resource person to the villagers regarding the water management since the village faced scarcity of water during winter season. The villagers responded to those questions and later made them to participate by way of drawing the village map and making houses, schools, churches, streets, water tanks and tabs, water sources, etc, on the ground with chalk. In this way the resource map of the village got prepared in shortest possible time and was cross-checked by the participants and the UBA volunteer. After that the drawing was taken on the paper by the villagers and the UBA volunteers. After the resource mapping the utilization of water of each household was being assessed where by the villagers participate in the form of acting out. From the assessment the villagers were made aware of their water utilization that the consumption of water is more than the water tank can store.

After the PRA exercise Mr. Tenny Mukhim, the Technical Assistant, Mr. Randolph Langstieh, the UBA Volunteers along with the Headman and few men of the village went to the area where the water sources located. They surveyed on the five water sources and the areas that the water flows. Mr. Tenny along with the UBA volunteers took the measurement of the areas where the water could be collected and also took the survey of the place as to check the possible ways to undertake in order to be able to come up with solutions of getting water even during the winter season.

Tuition Class:

Tuition classes for the children is one of the means to strengthen the bond between the parents of the children with the students' social worker. The UBA volunteers conducted tuition for the L.P School students on 24th & 31st March 2023, 14th ,21st & 28th April 2023 and 5th May 2023. Tuition helps and encourage the children to do studies outside of class hours. It is not only good for the students who might be behind for the school work or stress in the classroom but some students considered it necessary because it helps them to continue their studies in the flow and if they encounter any difficulties in certain subjects that they would be able to resolved it. The children gained much benefits from the tuition and gain confidence in approaching the students' social worker. There were about 40 children who frequented the tuition classes.

About the programme:

The UBA cell in collaboration with the NSS Unit of St. Edmund's College had conducted a PRA at Mylliem Kyndong Nongkyntir on the 13.5.23. This activity was conducted after long-delayed months, as it one of the important activities during the NSS special camps in the adopted village.

PRA in simple terms can be understood as an assessment and learning process that empowers the community people to create the information base for planning and action. It means an approach which

requires a good communication between the staffs and the community people to find out information about the problems, needs and potential in the community.

The resource person on the programme was, Mr. R. Langstieh, alongwith 8 NSS volunteers and NSS Programme Officers. The community people who were present comprised of youths and women organization, with a total representation of 18 individuals.

The programme started with the resource person initiating an ice breaking session, where he introduced himself to the local participants and they were also asked to do the same. He then asked the people about the problem they faced in the community and what needs to be focused. The resource person provided the participants with chart papers and stationaries in front of them. He asked them to participate by writing down in the chart papers.

The participants were asked questions about the local problems and the people willing agreed to have a discussion among themselves. After a short deliberation, they nominated one member to write for them. Some of the problems faced by the villagers and were noted down by the participants include the poor condition of the school, no proper drainage or no proper waste disposal.

Through this PRA the unit will be able to understand the community infrastructure and conditions properly. As an adopted village the unit now has the responsibility to know about the community and how the village functions.

Learning outcomes: The outcome of the programme was successful as a number of the community people had come to take part in the session. The students were able to learn about the skills and ways on how to engage with local community people and to try to encourage the people to open up and share their views and problems. Through the ice-breaking session the people were able to participate in listing down the problems that the community faced.
